COMMUNITY UPDATE

We have been notified by the Frankston Council School Crossings, Safer Communities Team, that as part of their annual application to the Department of Transport for funding of the School Crossings program the annual vehicle and pedestrian counts will be conducted week commencing Monday 17 February 2025.

If you see a camera mounted on a pole near the school, these are in place for the purpose of vehicle/pedestrian counts. The counts are conducted by Trans Traffic Surveys being councils preferred provider.

From the Sentral for Parents app select the INTERVIEWS tab


- Click on the **PARENT TEACHER INTERVIEW** tab on the home page or the **INTERVIEW** tab on the app.

Frankston Heights Primary Emergency Management Procedures

FHPS has an emergency management plan in place for a range of hazards, including, but not limited to, severe weather, medical emergencies, building fire and intruders. Specific response procedures have been developed to address perceived risks.

Drills are conducted throughout the year to ensure our core procedures of on-site and off-site evacuation, shelter-in-place and lockdown/lockouts are well-rehearsed and understood by staff and students.

In the event FHPS needs to enact our emergency management plan, Sentral will be used to communicate updates and actions to families, under the direction of the on-site emergency services. In the event of an emergency situation, please do not come to the school unless directed to do so, as you may put yourself and others in danger.

During an emergency, the school will work closely with emergency services to get specific advice to keep our community safe. Additionally, the Department of Education has dedicated emergency management staff to help monitor the situation and provide additional support to schools during emergencies.

Please be assured our top priority is the safety of our students and school community.

NOTE: DET provide schools with updates and advise schools when serious weather conditions or emergencies arise that may require cancellations of excursions, camps etc.

This term FHPS will conduct an on-site evacuation drill as part of the school's emergency management plan. The purpose of the drill is for staff, students and onsite visitors to practise how to evacuate in case of an emergency situation. Prior to the drill, students will participate in a preparation circle to discuss and reinforce evacuation procedures and behaviour expectations.
